A new year is upon us and right now it looks brighter. A vaccine my soon be available so we can shed our masks and return to a degree of normalcy. Hopefully that will find more people willing to volunteer.

For those who were unable to attend the annual meeting in November, here are few highlights:

While 2020 was a challenging year, we were able to continue our mission with 75 dogs and 72 cats taken in. We celebrated 68 dog adoptions with 10 dogs returned to their owners and 54 cat adoptions with 1 returned to its owner. Our total number of adoptions was only down by 1 compared to 2019. Hooray!

We did however, see a decline in Memberships, down to 89 from 119 in 2019. Our 2021 membership drive is currently underway. Please consider starting/continuing a membership. Also of note, this will be the last year that the \$35 Basic membership will be offered.

We had a few changes to our Board of Directors. **Penny Smith**, **Judy Martin** and **Lois Brusven** have fulfilled their terms and chosen to focus on other areas. **Penny Smith**, our former President, will continue seeking and applying for grants. Last year she won \$110,700 in grants for C.A.R.E. **Judy Martin**, former Board Member, provided CARE with outstanding photos and videos that highlighted the work at the shelter. And **Lois Brusven**, former Board Secretary, will continue as our Membership Chairman.

New Board of Director members were elected. Please welcome **Laura Bull**, Board secretary and kennel volunteer. **Michelle Champagne**, Board Member and kennel volunteer. **Deena Durecki**, Board Member and cattery volunteer.





Pet Insurance Is it worth it?

Owning pets and providing proper care for them is becoming increasingly more expensive. In fact, pet spending has more than doubled over the last 10 years. For this reason, clients often ask me about pet insurance. There are quite a few pet insurance companies out there and they all have different benefits and policies. This is why it is important to do some research before you hop on a plan.

You should first consider your reason for getting pet insurance. Are you trying to decrease the amount you have to pay for routine vet visits and vaccines at one time, or are you getting it specifically for emergency situations? Or both? Most insurance companies offer a variety of plans that could work well with your specific needs, but it is up to you to look through the fine print and catch the phrases that will keep your pet from being covered.

HERE ARE SOME MAIN POINTS TO CONSIDER.

- 1) Pet insurance companies only reimburse you after they receive the bill from your veterinarian. If you don't have the money on hand, you will have to find another way to pay the bill that day to be reimbursed later.
- **2)** The majority of companies will not pay for anything that could be considered a preexisting condition. For instance, if your dog has had an ear infection before, they will not be paying for future ear infections.
- **3)** Many insurances have a maximum payout which can be annually, per visit, or total for the lifetime of the pet. If your vet bill is over the amount, you may have to pay the rest out of pocket.
- **4)** Most insurance plans have deductibles, so you will have to choose what is reasonable for you.

Based on these concepts, I typically recommend insurance for people who have younger dogs or puppies with no preexisting health

conditions. I also recommend it for those who are worried about affording expensive emergency bills. Routine "wellness care" is technically made more expensive by insurance plans on an annual basis. But, most importantly, always read the fine print!

C.A.R.E. has a three acre shelter located in Ruskin and is a mostly volunteer effort. We rely on the generosity of public donations to continue our work. We have adopted over 2,000 animals and have spayed and neutered over 4,000 in our discount clinic. We are unique in the shelter-ing world as our animals do not spend their time living in cages. Dogs are outside during the day and cats live in three open bays. We encourage visits and offer tours to local groups.
