Looking back on 2021, it was a year of both challenges and accomplishments. CA.R.E. felt the impact of having no President or Membership Coordinator and several employee vacancies, while efforts to obtain new property and plans for the new building stalled. In turn, C.A.R.E. members, staff, volunteers, Board of Directors and the public rallied. A new President and Board member were elected, vacancies were filled with capable staff, the Membership Coordinator position was filled, and a new energy emerged. Your Board of Directors renewed efforts towards a new building, pursuing and establishing relationships within the community and identifying foundations that support capital projects aligned with our mission. A May Market fundraiser was the held, the first large event since Covid emerged. This new outdoor event raised over \$4,000 for C.A.R.E. and brought together many C.A.R.E. Alumni and old friends while making new ones. A Gift and Wine Fair was held in December, having been canceled in 2020 due to shutdowns. This major fundraiser exceeded all expectations with more than \$13,000 raised. 

Leptospirosis: Keep you and your dog safe!

Leptospirosis - you may or may not have heard of this disease, whether in its full name or by the more common "lepto" for short. Leptospirosis is a disease that is transmitted in contaminated urine, commonly from outdoor mammals, like raccoons, squirrels, mice, rats, etc. You may have heard your veterinarian briefly discuss vaccinating your pet for leptospirosis and why this is so important.



Dogs, by their naturally curious nature, are exposed to many potential diseases in the outside world. We know they'll go sniffing around and under bushes, drink random puddles of water, play in the mud at dog parks they're almost always in contact with some sort of humid, damp area when they're outside. If you think about it, wild animals also frequent these areas, where they will gather, eat, and....urinate. This is where the transmission of leptospirosis begins. For dogs that unfortunately contract the disease, it primarily infects the kidneys and liver. Signs of illness can be non-specific, such as fever, vomiting, urinating and drinking more than normal, or in the most severe cases, not urinating at all. These patients need aggressive care immediately for the best chances of survival. In nearly all cases, infected patients require multiple days of hospitalization.

Luckily the leptospirosis vaccine helps by immunizing your dog against this disease - first, a series of 2 shots, then annually. Another reason to consider vaccinating your dog for leptospirosis is that this disease is zoonotic, meaning humans can contract this disease from infected animals. Here in Florida, we have a lot of wet days (think hurricane season, rivers, lakes, and daily summer thunderstorms). As with any other vaccine, there remains a chance of vaccine reactions that we need to be mindful of. Talk to your veterinarian if your dog's lifestyle warrants vaccination. If your dog goes outside, even for a quick trip to the bathroom, or in apartment dwellings with a history of rat problems, this vaccine should be strongly considered.

Is It Safe to Take My Dog to the Dog Park?

Not every pup enjoys dog parks. Here's how to tell if your pooch would rather skip it.

Good pet parents take their dogs to off-leash dog parks, right? Not always, Natalie Marks, DVM, co-founder of Top Vets Talk Pets and veterinarian at VCA Blum Animal Hospital in Chicago, says. "Not every dog can go to the dog park and feel comfortable in that setting," she explains. "For some pups, the dog park can be a scary place. And taking a fearful pooch to the dog park can be downright dangerous."

Abiding by all the dos and don'ts of off-leash dog parks helps. But if your dog tends to be anxious or dog-reactive, a trip to the dog park likely won't be fun for your pup. Find out how to tell when it's best to avoid the dog park, and fun activities you can do together instead.



Signs You Should Avoid Dog Parks

Dogs that are already fearful or anxious at home are at a high risk of getting into a squabble at the dog park, Marks says. Skip going if your dog displays any of these fear- or anxiety-driven behaviors at home:

- Yawns a lot
- Paces
- Pante
- Startles easy
- Possessive of toys and food bowl
- Protective of you
- Doesn't play well with other dogs

How your dog responds to other dogs while walking on a leash is also a good indicator of how well he'll do at an off-leash dog park. If your pup starts to growl, excessively bark, or makes slow, deliberate movements when another dog approaches, it's a sign that he feels uncomfortable or even threatened. Does your dog act hesitant on walks? He's probably feeling nervous. In either case, your dog is showing signs of stress and probably won't do well at a dog park.


