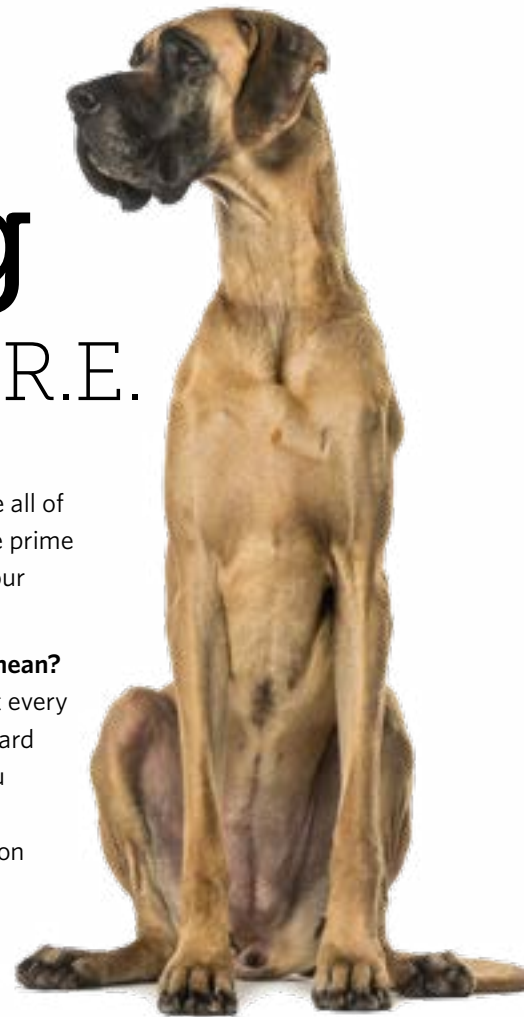

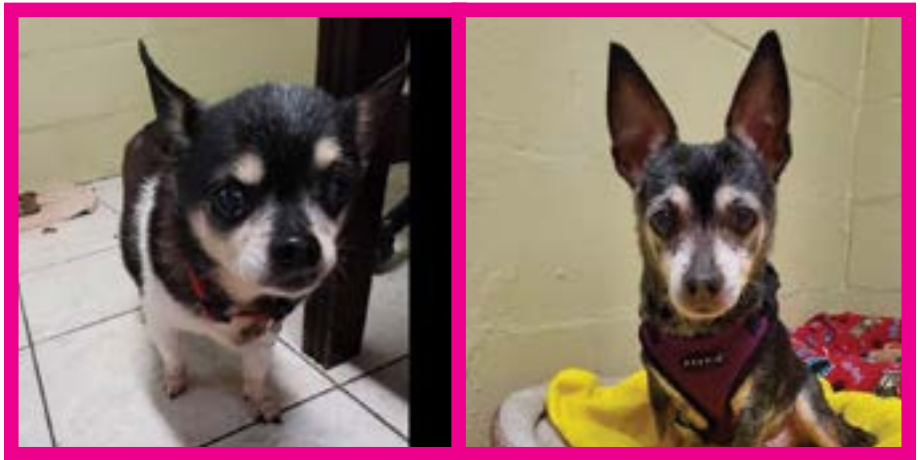

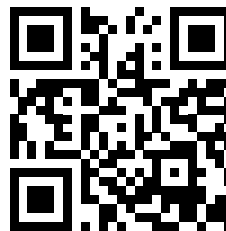

The Incredible Human -Animal Bond

It's a Saturday night and you notice that your dog has started scratching at his face. When you finally get a look, you notice that there is something wrong with his eye! What do you do? Is it worth an expensive visit to the emergency vet? Generally, the answer is yes, but there are a few specific signs you should be looking for to tell how urgent the problem is.

A red or cloudy looking eye can be caused by many different conditions. Not all of them are emergencies, but without special

training and tools it can be very difficult to tell what is happening. Redness around the eye can be caused by inflammation secondary to infections, allergies, lack of tear production, or irritants. Cloudy eyes can sometimes be normal in older animals, but can also be a sign of glaucoma, cataracts, or damage to the cornea.

Painful eyes are always emergencies. We rely on subtle clues and body language from animals to tell if they are painful. The most common signs of eye pain in dogs and cats are blinking and excessive tearing. If you see either of these, bring your pet in right away

If your pet experiences abrupt vision loss, they should be seen immediately. There are some conditions that can be reversed or stalled if the proper measures are taken.

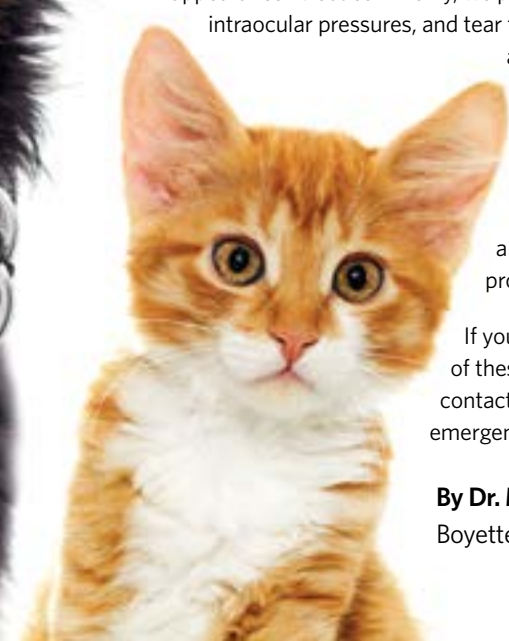
Rapid changes in size or shape of the eyeball are always emergencies. If it suddenly appears much larger or is sticking out, you should see your vet right away.

When you bring your pet in for an eye issue, your vet may choose to do one or several diagnostic tests based on symptoms and appearance. Most commonly, we perform corneal staining, intraocular pressures, and tear testing. Corneal staining

allows for visualization of any scratches or ulcers that may be invisible to the naked eye. Pressures allow us to screen for glaucoma and inflammation. Tear testing allows for quantification of tear production to screen for dry eye.

If you notice rapid development any of these symptoms in your animals, contact your veterinarian or nearest emergency vet.

Applesauce and Oatmeal Base Recipe for Cut-out Cookies

This is the base recipe for perfect cut-out cookies. You can combine this recipe with the red and green cookie doughs below for dazzling cookie creations, or just use natural food coloring to create any color cookies you like.

 Prep Time: 10 minutes
 Cook Time: 20 minutes
 Total Time: 30 minutes
 Yield: 1 tray 1x
 SCALE 1x2x3x

Ingredients

2 cups whole wheat flour (you can substitute with regular flour for a whiter dough)	2 eggs
2 cups rolled oat flour	2 tbs melted coconut oil
	1 cup unsweetened applesauce
	1 Tbsp Vanilla extract

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350°

Combine all ingredients in food processor or stand mixer. Add flour as necessary until dough is no longer sticky and is ready to roll out.

For different colored dough, divide into separate bowls and add natural food coloring.

Keep dough covered to prevent drying between batches. You can rehydrate dough with a little coconut oil as needed.

This dough refrigerates up to a week, and freezes for 3 months.

Gingerbread Cookies for Dogs

We used a blend of healthy whole wheat and oat flour our recipe, but you can use any type of flour that works for your dog's needs, or whatever you have on hand.

 Prep Time: 15 minutes
 Cook Time: 25 minutes
 Total Time: 40 minutes
 Yield: 1 Tray 1x
 SCALE 1x2x3x

Ingredients

1 1/2 cup whole wheat flour	Pinch of allspice
1 1/2 cup oat flour (made from rolled oats)	1/4 cup molasses
1 tsp baking powder	3/4 cup applesauce
1 Tbsp ground ginger	1 egg
1 tsp turmeric	1 tsp vanilla extract
1 tsp ground cinnamon	1 Tbsp coconut oil
Pinch of ground clove	OPTIONAL: carob chips for gingerbread eyes and buttons

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350°

Combine the flours, baking powder, and spices in a bowl and mix to combine.

Add the molasses and applesauce and mix to combine.

Add the egg, vanilla, and coconut oil and mix to combine, adding more flour if necessary.

Roll out gingerbread and cut into gingerbread men or your choice of shapes.

Bake at 350° for 20 minutes or until just starting to get golden around the edges for a soft cookie, or until crunchy for longer shelf life.
