From the President's Desk

2019 Roard of Directors

As we leave the long hot summer days behind us and head into the season of Fall Festivals and Holidays, I see my calendar filling up fast. There is a long list of community events where C.A.R.E. will be represented by volunteers on the Outreach Committee.

These events may be fundraisers, like the Gift and Wine Fair, or opportunities to find more shelter volunteers and showcase our dogs and cats, in order to find them homes. We could not do all this without our dedicated team of volunteers. If you would like to join the team, a volunteer application is available at the shelter and on the website at www.careshelter.org. We also welcome people who have a fundraising background. A list of some of the upcoming events is on page 8. We hope to meet you at one of these events.

There is a disturbing trend in our community. More and more animals are being abandoned on the streets to fend for themselves, or left at our gate, as the recent family of nine was. The parents and their seven puppies were left at around 11 p.m. and found at 7 a.m. the following morning. We had no choice but to take them in, even though we were full at the time, but the truth is that irresponsible acts like this put animals in danger and overload our already stretched resources. Protocol demands they be quarantined for 30 days, which is very difficult to do when we don't have the proper space. Going forward, all nine will need spaying or neutering, vaccinations and possibly other medical care. That is a considerable expense for the shelter and adoption fees will cover only a fraction of that expense. Your donations would help tremendously.

Preparing Your Home for a New Cat or Dog

Whether it's tightly sealing your garbage cans or paying attention to dangerous decorations during the holidays, you'll need to make your home safe before adopting. That includes keeping toxic foods, pet-unfriendly plants and dangerous household items out of paw's reach. Here are some suggestions for preparing your home to welcome a new canine or feline companion.

- Put a cozy bed for your pet in every room. Pets are much more likely to keep off of furniture if they have attractive alternatives.
- If you have a cat, try putting double-sided sticky tape or upside-down carpet runners on furniture to discourage her from scratching.
- Avoid vertical blinds, pooling drapery, ornate tassels and long cords that can become strangulation hazards.
- If you have cats, be sure to install high-quality metal screens on all windows.
- It may be a good idea to roll up and store decorative rugs until your new dog is fully house-trained.
- Provide your new cat with a variety of scratching posts and perches.
- Use dog crates and gates to confine your new dog when home alone until his house manners earn him unsupervised freedom.
- Provide plenty of "legal" things for your dog to chew. If he has attractive toys and bones of his own, he'll be much less likely to gnaw on your things!
- Check to make sure that plants in and around your home are not poisonous to pets.







I joined CARE in early 2006, shortly after retiring. I became acquainted with the shelter while attending the Ruskin Seafood Festival in Simmons Park. I began working Wednesday mornings with the dogs and was soon tapped to assist on spay and neuter days to clean the instruments after surgery. I did that for about seven years. While I no longer do that, I have continued to clean and

maintain the autoclave which is used to sterilize the instruments.

A couple years ago I became Wednesday shift lead when Juli Thome moved to Arizona. I also replaced her on CARE's Board of Directors at that time. I had been attending meetings as an interested volunteer for almost a year before that. I have been vice president for the past year.

As a board member, I am the chair of the Emergency Planning Committee and a member of the Long Range Planning Committee. For the past two years I have been picking up donations from Amazon to supply CARE's food shed. After my wife Becki retired a couple years ago, I convinced her to volunteer at CARE, which she does on Saturdays in the office and Mondays in the cattery.

We have a dog which we adopted from CARE about two years ago. He was Gerber then and now he is Rex.

How Spaying Your Pet Could Save Its Life


Did you know that spaying your female dog or cat does more than just prevent an accidental pregnancy? It also eliminates the risk of a deadly disease, pyometra. This term literally means "a uterus filled with pus." I once removed a canine uterus that weighed over 5 pounds due to the fluid and infection that accumulated! This condition occurs more frequently in older females who have never had a litter; usually a few months after their heat cycle has ended. They are at an increased risk as they age due to the hormonal effects that can cause the walls of the uterus to become diseased and leak fluid. Symptoms may be fairly obvious with pus dripping from the vulva or excessive licking of the area. Other times symptoms can be quite vague. Pets may act lethargic, not want to eat as much, drink a lot of water, vomit, or even have a swollen belly.

Cats are excellent at hiding illness until it becomes severe, so even minor symptoms should be addressed with your veterinarian. Without treatment this infection can progress until the uterus eventually ruptures and life-threatening sepsis ensues. Thankfully, if caught early, most dogs and cats will make a full recovery. The diagnosis must be confirmed with bloodwork, x-rays, and sometimes an ultrasound.

Once I saw a suspected pyometra that in reality was a surprise pregnancy when x-rays were taken! The cornerstone of treatment is emergency surgery to remove the infected uterus and ovaries. This surgery is similar to a spay except it carries a higher complication rate due to the risk of the uterus tearing or leaking. Antibiotics, as well as pain medications and hospitalization with intravenous fluids are also required.

If your family includes a middle aged to older dog or cat, consider having them spayed now before a pyometra has time to develop. Not only is a traditional spay substantially less expensive, but it is also safer for your beloved pet.
